The children will be working towards the following skills tailored to the their needs:







Mathematics

<u>Number</u>

- Count up to 15 objects and recognise different representations of the number.
- Explore and order numbers to 15.
- · Identify one more or fewer.

Calculation, grouping and sharing

- Explore addition as counting on and subtraction as taking away.
- Counting objects and divide them in equal groups.
- Grouping objects into fives and tens.
- Explore what <u>grouping and sharing</u> means.
- · Explore doubling objects.
- Explore halving objects.4

Space, shape and measure

- Explore, describe and sort 2D and 3D shapes.
- · Recognise and create patterns.

Art and Design

- Investigate and emulate the artwork of Catherine Rayner.
- Sing songs linked to the topic.
- Act out the Augustus story.

Continued individualised time to focus on OT targets & tine motor skills: convey meaning.

Science

- · Explore the states of water.
- Investigate minibeasts animals.

- · Explore Bee-bots.
- Programme Bee-bots by giving commands (pushing buttons) using visual instruction cards.

Listening & Attention

<u>Writing</u>


- Explore mark-making tools independently.

- Use phonic knowledge to write words in different ways e.g. on sensory materials, using magnetic letters, overwriting yellow words, etc.
- Spell some words correctly.
- Trace/write some irregular common words.
- Trace/Copy/Write simple sentences.

Reading

- Share a poem book and turn pages independently.
- Enjoys looking at book pictures and points at them on request.
- · Read and follow recipes and instructions.
- Read and understand simple and more complex sentences.
- Use phonic knowledge to decode regular and common irregular words and read them aloud.
- Demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read.

Speaking

- Respond to interaction with others by smiling, looking, making sounds, using symbols, actions, signing or words.
- Find ways to express themselves effectively when talking about events that have happened or are to happen in the future.
