The children will be working towards the following skills tailored to the their needs:

Mathematics

Number

- Count up to 20 objects and recognise different representations of the number.
- Explore and order numbers to 20.
- Identify one more or fewer.

Calculation

- Explore addition and subtraction.
- Compare two amount of objects.
- Explore doubling and halving numbers.

Measurement

- Explore and recognise the value of different coins.
- Explore and compare the capacities of everyday objects.
- Compare different volumes of objects.
- Explore and compare the weight of everyday objects.
- Explore the length of different objects and order them.

Shape & Pattern

- · Sort 2D shapes on the basis of one and two criteria
- · Use 2-D shapes to recognise, continue and create patterns
- Describe and sort 2D shapes on the basis of one and two criteria

Physical Development

Continued individualised time to focus on OT targets & tine motor skills: convey meaning.

Take part in co-ordination activities.

Art and Design

- Use sticks, stones, mud and leaves to make small worlds for toy people and animals. E.g. to make a stick fort in the builder's tray for soldiers or an outside habitat for wild animals.
- Decorate sticks with ribbons, string, chalk and paint
- Sketch pieces of bark and interesting sticks
- Use sticks to construct, various creative masterpieces in theme with 'Stanley's stick.

Writing


- Explore mark-making tools independently.

- Use phonic knowledge to decode regular and common irregular words and read them aloud.
- Demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read.
