Car Park Consultation

In response to parent/carer feedback on parking and the use of the external area at the front of the school:

SLOW DOWN
KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE IN SCHOOL ZONES

You said...

At times the car park is very busy.

The car park area is confusing.

Lack of safety barriers between the car park and pedestrians.

We did...

Put in place traffic calming measures in the form of speed humps and speed restriction signage.

Created a one-way system for vehicles in the parent/visitor car park.

Put in place staff supervision initially whilst drivers got used to the new car-park format.

We installed yellow and black ground level vehicle stoppers to encourage drivers to use the one-way system.

Posts in the car-park will be padded to limit possible damage to vehicles.

Built planters as a barrier between the Secondary and Main entrances and the car park.

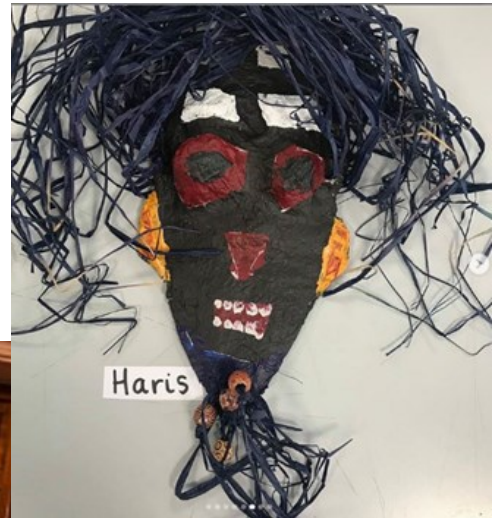

Free assistance for vulnerable EU families to apply to post-Brexit settlement scheme

Are you one of the 40,000 EU Citizens who live in Hounslow?

This is your home too

What is the EU Settlement Scheme?

If you are an EU citizen, then the Settlement Scheme allows you and your close family members to continue to live and work in the UK after Brexit. Registration under the scheme will mean that you will remain eligible for:

- Public services, such as healthcare and schools
- Public funds and pensions
- British citizenship, if you want to apply and meet the requirements

How to Apply

If you're an Hounslow resident and EU citizen then call the free and confidential advice line for support or visit in person for free immigration advice that can assist you to apply for your settled status.

Services include one-to-one appointments, digital assistance, printing, scanning and support available in every European language.
