

They have been learning about the process of brain storming ideas, researching how to produce their products, and then testing their creations. uss have been learning about types of trace evidence such as shoe prints, fingerprints and hairs and fibres. The pupils have practised lifting fingerprints from objects and identifying the different patterns and points of uniqueness. US5 have also recapped how to use microscopes as these will be needed to observe hairs and fibres.



Land-based studies







We ended the year with our learners finishing some of their assessments in BTEC. The units we have been focusing on are 'Tool maintenance' and 'Preparing a bed for planting'. On tool maintenance, learners need to check that the tools are fit for purpose, clean, oil and return to the tool shed.

On assessment, preparing your bed for planting involves the following: weeding, double digging, adding fertilizers, consolidating, placing a drill line, seeding or planting out, and cleaning and storing all tools.
